Since the Revived! Watanabe Seitei -The Solitary Virtuoso, 2017-, Kashima Arts has been introducing the brilliant works by Seitei.

Marking the fourth of the series, this exhibition features approximately 15works by Seitei including a rare quadtych, Flowers and Birds of the Four Seasons (Spring: Dove on Cedar Tree, Summer: Winged Bean and Magpie, Autumn: White Hibiscus, Winter: Hawk on Pine Tree). Also on view, are the works by other virtuosos such as Maruyama Okyo, Nagasawa Rosetsu, Araki Kanpo, Shiba Kokan, Kaburaki Baikei and more. Come experience the world of flower-and-bird paintings through the artists' keen observant eye, excellent brushwork and gorgeous colors.

## About Watanabe Seitei

Watanabe Seitei is well-known for being a solitary painter who lived through the turbulent Meiji Period to Taisho Period and captivated the West with his extraordinary technique of painting flowers and birds.

He honed his brushwork and drawing skills under Kikuchi Yosai, after which through his work at an export company that dealt with arts and crafts, he polished his stylish sense and realistic expression of the West, expanding the range of his works, creating designs for ceramics and cloisonné together with Namikawa Sosuke. He was dispatched to Paris by the same company, becoming the first Japanese painter to study abroad in the West, and through exchanges with Impressionist painters such as Edgar Degas, Seitei developed his own unique and sophisticated style, that combined characteristics of Japan and Europe.

The flower and bird paintings, which account for 8-9% of his work, are depicted with exquisite brushwork, and have rich decorativeness and color beauty.

Seitei was active internationally, including exhibiting at the World Expo and holding solo exhibitions in London, but in his later years he distanced himself from the central art world. He has been forgotten in Japanese art history for a long time, but has revived and gained popularity in recent years.
