Japanese Art Auction MEGURU Vol.24 Begins



Kashima Art Co., Ltd. (hereinafter referred to as Kashima Arts) is proud to present the prestigious Japanese Art Auction MEGURU Vol.24 from November 22 (Sat) to November 30 (Sun), 2025.

Launched in 2019, the Japanese Art Auction MEGURU specializes in Japanese art, ranging from Edo to modern Japanese paintings, as well as Western-style paintings, calligraphy, prints, and crafts. The auction has introduced carefully selected works from across Japan to art enthusiasts both domestically and internationally.

This final auction of 2025 will feature 606 works by masters who have left an impressive mark on the history of Japanese art. A diverse collection of exquisite Japanese art, cherished across the ages, will be brought together under one roof, including an Edo Rinpa work by Kiitsu, a rare flower basket by Taikan, an autumn plants painting by Shunso, an auspicious rising sun by Kano Hogai, a bijin-ga by Togo Seiji, calligraphy and paintings by Matsuo Basho, woodblock prints by Munakata Shiko, and an elegant tea bowl by Itaya Hazan.

The special feature will focus on Ohashi Suiseki, known for his majestic tiger paintings; Tanaka Isson, whose retrospective at the Tokyo Metropolitan Art Museum remains vivid in our memories; Tsutaka Waichi, who left behind abstract paintings filled with poetic sentiment; and Hakuin Ekaku, the founder of the Rinzai school of Zen Buddhism, who produced numerous Zen paintings with a touch of humor.

Ohashi Suiseki

Ohashi Suiseki's paintings of tigers exude a realism that seems to leap from the canvas, vividly capturing the vital energy in the tiger's sharp gaze and supple form. He was the only Japanese painter to receive the Gold Medal at the 1900 Paris Exposition and went on to win gold medals at both the Louisiana Purchase Exposition and the Japan-British Exhibition. Having achieved this distinction three times, he stands as a representative painter of the Meiji period, highly acclaimed both in Japan and abroad. His talent was once regarded on par with Yokoyama Taikan and Takeuchi Seiho, but after distancing himself from the art world in his later years, he came to be known as a "phantom master." This auction will feature 25 works, including animal and landscape paintings, such as pieces exhibited at the Fukuda Art Museum's "Expo: Nihonga in Profusion Hokusai, Taikan, Suiseki," as well as an exceptional tiger painting that exemplifies Suiseki's true mastery.

Tanaka Isson

Tanaka Isson's retrospective exhibition at the Tokyo Metropolitan Art Museum last fall remains vivid in our memories. In 1938, at the age of 29, he moved from Tokyo to Chiba, where he spent about 20 years working as a farmer while continuing to pursue painting. Although he did not receive recognition from the art world during that time, Isson remained devoted to his art, producing works that possess a distinct charm, different from those created under his art name "Beison" or during his later years in Amami.

This special feature presents five works from his later period in Chiba. Of particular note is "Chiba-dera Temple in the Four Seasons", which depicts the changing seasons of Chiba-dera Town. These valuable works reflect Isson's warm gaze as he observed the familiar landscapes and people around him.

Tsutaka Waichi

Tsutaka Waichi was one of the leading figures in postwar Japanese abstract painting. He began his career as a poet but turned to painting after experiencing wartime oppression. Gaining international recognition, he exhibited at the São Paulo Art Biennial in 1952 and received the Guggenheim Award in 1960.

This special feature presents 10 works, including two large-scale paintings (each size 50) created during his prime period. Tsutaka's works, which express emotion through abstract lines and planes, are tranquil yet profoundly moving, leaving a quiet resonance in the viewer's heart.

Hakuin Ekaku

Hakuin Ekaku, active in the mid-Edo period, was the founder of the Rinzai sect of Zen Buddhism. He occupies an important place in Japanese art history for his ability to convey Zen teachings through accessible paintings and calligraphy. Hakuin's Zen paintings possess a distinctive and unmatched presence, characterized by generous, bold, and spirited brushwork.

The more one looks at Hakuin's works, the deeper their appeal becomes. This auction will feature 11 pieces, including "Calligraphy (Thoughts)", which extols loyalty and filial piety, as well as "Treasure Mallet" and "Ant on a Stone Mill", which illuminate the nature of humanity with a touch of humor.






